The School Development Plan 2019-2020

By reviewing our priorities for the year 2018-2019, taking into account changes in the Ofsted Inspection Framework and building on our successes of the last year we have identified the following areas we will be focussing on this year.

Priority 1: CURRICULUM

To enrich the children's experiences and provide purposeful learning through a progressive, broad and balanced curriculum. To increase all pupils' knowledge base and application of skills in order to support overall attainment and progress.

Priority 2: INCLUSION

Children with barriers to learning will make rapid progress in order to close gaps in expected attainment through the graduated approach of 'plan, do and review' both inside and outside the classroom.

Priority 3: ENGLISH

To improve children's English skills through their understanding and use of language.



Drinks Bottles




Head Teachers Award
